FROM THE LAST MEETING: Mr. Knight Cox spoke about the Clemson University Forest. In 1934 the federal government established a program that was focused on the purchase of sub- marginal farmland throughout the country which was to be purchased under the provisions of the Bankhead-Jones Farm Tenant Act. August 7th, 1934 – Dr. George Aull's proposal is accepted under the condition that future ownership and management of the land be guaranteed. September, 1934 – Over 200+ parcels of land were acquired totaling nearly 30,000 acres at \$13 per acre. In 1939 Clemson College officially took over supervision of the property under a 95 year cooperative and license agreement with the federal government.
